South Carolina Joins NAFSCE Pre-Service Family Engagement Consortium

We are excited to announce that South Carolina is one of seven states that are represented on a newly formed national *Pre-Service Family Engagement Consortium* sponsored by The National Association for Family, School, and Community Engagement (NAFSCE) and its partners. The goal of this initiative is to advance the development of educator preparation programs that equip educators and administrators with the knowledge, skills, and experiences needed to engage families and communities as a strategy for student achievement and school improvement.



Seven state teams comprised of representatives from state education agencies and select educator preparation programs were chosen from a highly competitive pool of applicants to serve on the Consortium. In addition to South Carolina, the states represented are California, Colorado, Hawaii, Maryland, North Dakota, and Wisconsin.

UofSC College of Education faculty member and CFEC Specialist Dr. Michele Myers is representing the University of South Carolina College of Education on the South Carolina team, which also includes Yolande' Anderson, Director of the Office of Family and Community Engagement, SC Department of Education; Dr. James Ritter, Education Services Department, SC Department of Education; Dr. Anthony Pittman, Dean of the School of Education at Claflin University; and representatives of other schools of education from around the state.

We believe that effective preparation for teachers and administrators in our Colleges of Education is a key component to increasing the level of family and community engagement in early childhood and K-12 schools. Congratulations to Dr. Myers and all of the members of the South Carolina team!

We will keep you updated on the Consortium's work over the next 18 months.

Coming Soon - Ready, Set - Kindergarten!

Ready, Set – Kindergarten! gives parents, caregivers, and teachers a colorful, easy to read family guide for age 3, age 4 preschool, and age 5 kindergarten development. There are six separate booklets, one for each of the areas of growth and development, that bridge the development indicators of the Early Learning Standards with the kindergarten standards of the College and Career Ready Standards. The six guides cover:

- Approaches to Play and Learning
- Emotional and Social Development
- Health and Physical Development
- Language Development
- Mathematical Thinking
- Cognitive Development



Included in each booklet are explanations of a domain's individual sub-goals with samples of the endof-age development indicators for that sub-goal. Also included are numerous at-home activities to help caregivers understand ways to aid their child's development. Additional resources are listed for information, games, and activities available on smart phones and computers.

The Ready, Set – Kindergarten! guides will soon be available, as will a poster focusing on the at-home activities suggested in the guides. Watch for more info - or contact us for more details!
